

# How to Use Disqus

Disqus is a good option to allow your clients or members to leave the comment to you. Make sure that you have an account with Disqus and register your site to get it a shortname already. You can register it here: <http://disqus.com/admin/register/>

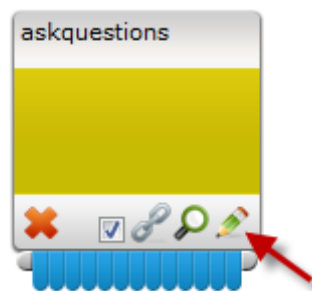

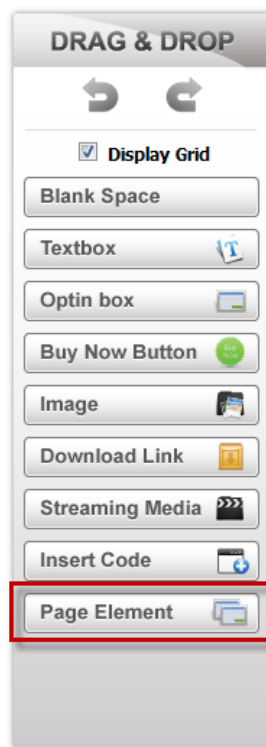

The "**Site URL**" is the url of the website which you want to insert the Disqus comment element on the page. Then follow the instructions below.

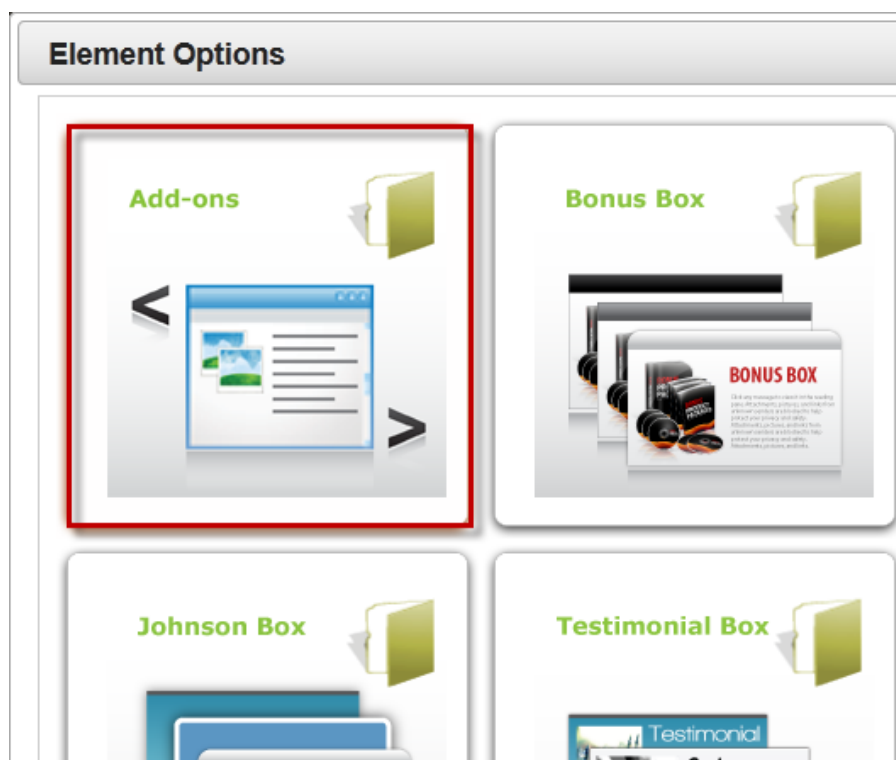
**Step 1:** Go to the content site that you want to use Disqus plug-in and open the page.



**Step 2:** Drag the "Page Element" to the content area.



**Step 3:** Select "Add-ons" option.



**Step 4:** Select "disqus.html".
