

Where to Access to the cPanel?

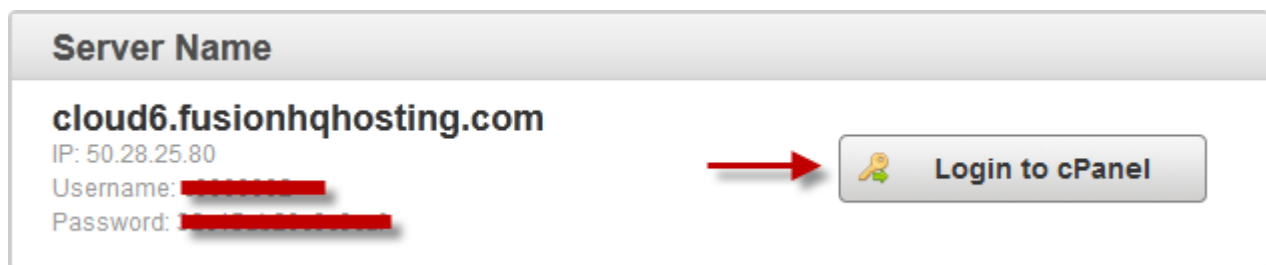
CPanel is a web based hosting account control panel that helps you manage your domain through a web browser. You can manage tasks such as creating the subpath of your website, setting up the email accounts, creating new folders, uploading or removing files. FusionHQ subscribers are able to access to the cPanel directly from their accounts.

Please do not change the password of your cPanel otherwise FusionHQ cannot be connected to your cPanel anymore.

Step 1: Go to "Domains and Hosting" and click on "cPanel" button.



Step 2: Click "Login to cPanel" button.



Step 3: At the cPanel, you can manage your website at any section.
